Title: Argumentation in the Spanish and Russian-speaking political discourse

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Topical Importance:

The argument in political communication needs a theoretical understanding of the strategic reasoning tools available to the actors (presidents, heads of government, members of parliament, MPs, etc.) that give rise to political discourse that determines the relevance of this study.

Goals:

The purpose of this study is to describe the characteristics of the discursive features in the presidential speeches of presidential candidates in Venezuela and Russia in 2004.

Tasks:

- study the basic theoretical premises associated with the provisions of discourse analysis in modern linguistics;
- define the concept of argumentation;
- identify the main ways of reasoning used in political discourse;
- describe the situation in Venezuela and Russia in 2004;
- identify, to describe and classify the main linguistic characteristics of reasoning in the speeches of candidates in Venezuela and Russia in 2004, taking into account their contribution to the realization of the target setting of the speech event.
