Relevance of the research topic. Economic relations between Russia and China attract the attention of many scientists and journalists due to the fact that China is the main trading partner of Russia. The governments of Russia and China are creating a solid institutional framework for building long-term economic relations. Russia and China have declared each other their strategic partners. These countries are moving towards a new model of relations between countries with different socio-economic systems.

The purpose of the research is the assessment of the current state and prospects of economic cooperation between Russia and China.

Research Objectives:

- to analyze the current problems of bilateral economic relations between Russia and China;
- to study the main areas of the Russian-Chinese economic partnership at the present stage of development;
- to identify possible prospects for the development of economic relations between Russia and China.

The scientific novelty of the research is determined by the fact that based on the analysis of the current stage of economic relations between Russia and China, the main future directions of development of this cooperation are identified, the main scenarios of development of trade and economic relations between Russia and China are shown too. Special attention is paid to the roles of both countries in this partnership.

The structure of the work consists of introduction, two chapters, which include four paragraphs each, a conclusion, a 113-reference bibliography (15 of them are in foreign languages) and two attachments. The total volume is 75 pages.

Summary

The main Russian exports to China are energy resources. Russian-Chinese projects in Russia are also mainly concentrated in the energy sector. In this regard, the diversification of Russian exports is an urgent task. In addition, it is important for Russia to attract Chinese capital not only in the raw materials industry, but also in the deep processing of raw materials in Russia. The development of these projects in the digital economy and high technologies is particularly promising.
